» OUR REVIEW

Beautiful watercolour insects crawl through this book, with each page presenting the tail of an insect and a set of clues as to which insect it belongs to. The clues encourage children to interact with each page and, from the information provided, discern what the insect could be. The book also weaves in educational facts about insects, some amusing, to keep young readers engaged and learning. An aesthetically gorgeous, simplistic and informative resource with high educational and entertainment value.

>> OUR REVIEW


This heart-warming and slightly mischievous story about a polar bear and his family, inspires creativity and encourages the appreciation of art. After returning home from the city with gifts of art supplies for his cubs, Bear falls asleep as a white bear, but wakes up as a rainbow bear. Puzzled and curious, he goes swimming and comes up white again... only to be rainbow once more the next morning.

This pattern continues until Bear uncovers the culprits—his own cubs. He lets them draw on him for the rest of the day, but that night, Bear gets up to his own mischief. Once morning comes, his whole family are rainbow bears. Bear and his family spend the day playing and colouring each other, and when the day is over, they all go swimming. Bear's

family decides that next time he goes travelling, they want to go.

Full of colour and curiosity, the illustrations are sure to delight and inspire young readers.

This inspired Griff to write his own book to send to the children at Changi as a Christmas gift—The Happiness Book. Illustrated by a fellow soldier, it told the story of three friends who discover a box containing the secrets to happiness. The book never reaches Changi due to suspicion from the enemy, and the order is given that it is to be destroyed.

However, after the liberation, The Happiness Book is dug up from the barrack gardens and taken back to Australia, where it became a national treasure.

Wonderfully illustrated, this simplified but evocative recount of this important historical artefact shows the importance of kindness—and books.
